¹ Major General Lawrenson commanded the 17th Lancers in the Eastern Campaign of 1854-55, including the cavalry affair of Bulganac and battle of Alma. Appointed in July 1855, with the rank of Brigadier-General to the Heavy Brigade, consisting of the 1st 4th and 5th Dragoon Guards, 1st 2nd and 6th Dragoons, which he commanded at the battle of Tchernaya. Succeeded Sir James Scarlett, in December following, in command of the British cavalry in the East, which command he held until the return of the army in 1856 (Medal and Clasp, Sardinian and Turkish Medals, and 4th Class of the Medjidie).

² Major Heneage served the Eastern campaign of 1854-55, including the battles of Alma, Balaklava, Inkerman, Tchernaya, affairs of Bulganac, M'Kenzie's Farm, siege of Sebastopol, and expedition to Kerch (Medal with four Clasps, and Turkish Medal). Served in Rajpootana and Central India in 1858-59 and was present at the capture of Kotah, reoccupation of Chundaree, battle of Kotah ke Serai, captures of Gwalior and Powree, battle of Sindwaho, and actions of Koorwya and Naharghur: at Gwalior he commanded a squadron of the 8th Hussars which made a sudden and successful attack upon the enemy's camp in which the Rane of Jitunsee was killed and several guns captured, for this he received the Victoria Cross (Brevet of Major, Medal and Clasp).

³ Major Puget served on the expedition to Kerch, and at the siege of Sebastopol (Medal and Clasp, and Turkish Medal). Served in Rajpootana in 1858-59 and was present at the capture of Kotah and action of Koorshana (mentioned in despatches, Medal and Clasp).

⁴ Major Penton served with the 3rd Light Dragoons throughout the Sutlej campaign of 1845-6, and was present at the battles of Moodkee (charger killed), Ferozeshah (charger killed), and Sobraon (Medal and two Clasps). Also throughout the Punjab campaign of 1848-49, including the cavalry affair at Ramnuggur, passage of the Chenab at Wuzerabad on the 1st December 1848, with the force under Sir Joseph Thackwell, action of Sadoolapore, and battles of Chillianwallah and Goojerat (Medal and two Clasps). Served with the 12th Lancers in the Crimea from 9th May 1855 and was present at the battle of the Tchernaya, siege and fall of Sebastopol (Medal and Clasp, and Turkish Medal). Served with the 8th Hussars in the Indian Campaign in 1858-59 and was present at the capture of Kotah, reoccupation of Chundaree, battle of Kotah ke Serai, capture of Gwalior, siege of Powree, action of Beejapore, battle of Sindwaho (horse wounded), actions of Koorwya and Koondrye (mentioned in despatches, Medal and Clasp).

⁵ Captain Mussenden served the Eastern campaign of 1854-55, including the battles of Alma, Balaklava (horse shot), Inkerman, and Tchernaya, affairs of Bulganac and M'Kenzie's Farm, and siege of Sebastopol (Medal and four Clasps, 5th Class of the Medjidie, and Turkish Medal). Served in Rajpootana in 1858-59 and was present at the capture of Kotah and battle of Kotaria (Medal and Clasp).

⁶ Captain Palliser served in Central India in 1858-59 and was present at the action of Boordah (mentioned in despatches, Medal and Clasp).

⁷ Captain Montagu served with the 8th Hussars the campaigns of 1858-59 in Rajpootana and Central India and was present at the capture of Kotah, reoccupation of Chundaree, battle of Kotah ke Serai, capture of Gwalior, and actions of Koondrye and Boordah (Medal and Clasp).

9 Captain Chaplin served with the 67th Regt. in the Chinese campaign of 1860, was present in the action at Sinho, taking of Tonghoo, and storming of the Takoo fort where he carried the Queen's colour after Ens. Fraser was wounded, crossed the ditch at the head of the Regt., and was severely wounded in planting the colour on the cavalier at a very early period and before the fort surrendered (Medal and Clasp, and Victoria Cross).

10 Lieut. Clarke served the Eastern campaign of 1854-55, including the battles of Alma, Balaklava (wounded), Inkerman, and the Tchernaya, affairs of Bulganak and M'Kenzie's farm. Expedition to Kertch, siege and fall of Sebastopol (Medal and four Clasps, Medal for distinguished conduct, and Turkish Medal). Served in the Indian Campaigns in 1858-59 and was present at the capture of Kotah and pursuit of the Rebels with Brigadier Honner (Medal and Clasp).

12 Major Dutery and Vet. Surgeon Grey served the Eastern campaign of 1854-55, including the battles of Alma, Balaklava, Inkerman, and Tchernaya, affairs of Bulganak and M'Kenzie's farm, and siege of Sebastopol (Medal and four Clasps and Turkish Medal). Served in Rajpootana and Central India in 1858-59, including the capture of Kotah, reoccupation of Chundaree, battle of Kotah ke Serai, capture of Gwalior, actions of Koondrye and Boordah (Medal and Clasp). Vet. Surgeon Grey was also present at the siege and capture of Powree, battle of Sindwaho, and action of Koorwye.

13 Riding Master Pickworth served the Eastern campaign of 1854-55, including the reconnaissance to Silistria, battles of Alma, Balaklava, Inkerman, and the Tchernaya, affairs of Bulganak and M'Kenzie's farm, siege and fall of Sebastopol (Medal and four Clasps, French War Medal, and Turkish Medal). Served in the Indian campaigns of 1858-59 and was present at the capture of Kotah, reoccupation of Chundaree, battle of Kotah ke Serai, capture of Gwalior, and action of Boordah (Medal and Clasp).

14 Qr. Master Carey served in the Crimea and has the Medal with Clasp for Sebastopol, and the Turkish Medal. Served in the Indian campaigns in 1858-59 and was present at the capture of Kotah, taking of Chundaree, battle of Kotah ke Serai, capture of Gwalior, siege and capture of Powree, battle of Sindwaho, actions of Koorwye and Naharghur (Medal and Clasp).

15 Surgeon Llewelyn served the Eastern campaign of 1854-55, including the battles of Alma, Balaklava, and Inkerman, siege and fall of Sebastopol (Medal and four Clasps, and Turkish Medal). Served with the 8th Hussars in the Indian campaign of 1858-59 and was present at the action of Boordah (Medal).
